WHEREAS, the Digestive Health Foundation of Chicago addresses this far-reaching problem by raising funds to support cutting-edge medical research, physician training, and education at the Northwestern Medicine Digestive Health Center; and,

WHEREAS, the important discoveries made by the physician-scientists at Northwestern Medicine's Digestive Health Center help prevent, treat, and ultimately cure a spectrum of digestive disorders including colon, pancreatic, and esophageal cancers, Crohn's disease, ulcerative colitis, celiac disease, swallowing disorders, hepatitis, and other liver diseases; and,

THEREFORE, I, JB Pritzker, Governor of the State of Illinois, do hereby proclaim May 2024 as **Digestive Health** Awareness Month in Illinois and recognize the Digestive Health Foundation for its efforts to positively change the landscape of digestive health.
